Honorable Mayor and Members of the Los Angeles City Council, the Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council is writing in SUPPORT of the City's resolution regarding SB 678. Homelessness has been on the rise in our local community, and we are concerned about all demographics of our unhoused neighbors, particularly women of color who are more vulnerable to violence on the streets. Many unhoused women are survivors of domestic abuse, and many suffer from mental illness. Focusing on these women as a subgroup will allow for more targeted services to meet their needs.

The economic and financial hardship caused by the Covid-19 pandemic coupled with a lack of affordable housing in Los Angeles promises to increase the number of unhoused in the year(s) ahead. The additional data provided through enactment of this bill would support local agencies and non-profit organizations in developing programs that meet the diverse needs of various unhoused demographics.
