### **4. Presentation by Local Service Club - Sunland-Tujunga Shadow Hills Rotary Club [3]**

Roger Klemm gave the presentation. He described its organizational goals and activities including improving access to clean water and ending polio.

### **5. LAPD Updates - SLO Caloca / SLO Contreras**

SLO Contreras gave the update. He stated that crime had decreased compared to last year, but that violent crime and robberies had increased compared to last month. He discussed the 4118 LAMC ordinance which aims to increase enforcement of rights-of-way being obstructed by homeless encampments. He stated that there was a recent stabbing at Sunland Park. He said this was being classified as a robbery as an attempted robbery preceded the stabbing-

Ms. Perdue asked about a shooting on Foothill Blvd. SLO Contreras stated he would have to look into the matter.

### **6. Comment by Elected Officials/Representatives, Done, City Departments (3 min per Representative) -**

**Kelly Gonez**, LAUSD School Board member, spoke about school reopening. She asked for input regarding the qualifications for the search of the next LAUSD superintendent and spoke about two upcoming BD6 meetings.

Cheryl Schmidt asked about parental consent for vaccines. Ms. Gonez stated parental consent would be required.

**Eve Sinclair**, from Councilwoman Monica Rodriguez's office discussed a new left turn phasing signal at the intersection of Foothill Blvd and Tujunga Ave, Tujunga Ave's designation as a Vision Zero corridor, Green Street improvement projects, sewer project at Tujunga Canyon and Marcus Ave, the Howard Finn lighting project, the Verdugo Pool, Project Homekey, posted comprehensive cleanings of encampments, spot cleanings, an EMROD volunteer cleaning later this month, and street resurfacing.

Cindy Cleghorn asked how many properties would be involved for the sewer project, whether the costs would be shared by the City, and the plans for Commerce Ave. Ms. Rodriguez stated 661 households would be involved, several cost-cutting methods would be used, and described the outreach efforts and plans for the Green Streets project.

Jon Von Gunten asked about cuts to the Valley Traffic police presence on Foothill Blvd. Ms. Sinclair stated that there had been City-wide cuts to all departments and that there had been a police presence on the street.

Kathleen Travers asked about violence against women in encampments. Ms. Sinclair stated that there was a separate housing shelter for women especially at risk of violence or victims of violence.

Ms. Schmidt asked about parking restrictions for RV's seven foot or longer. Ms. Sinclair stated that those vehicles could be ticketed and towed for continuous violations if residents called parking enforcement.

**Mary Jerejian**, from Assemblywoman Rivas's office, stated that the Assemblywoman had helped secure funding for a Hispanic STEM students program and that due to community outreach she had decided not to support SB 9 and SB 10.

Vanessa Serrano, representative to DONE, discussed the upcoming Civic U's training session, Congress of Neighborhoods, code of conduct workshops, and the NC financial training session.

**7. Presentation: Sean Kleckner, LA City Park Ranger and Board Member Director Los Angeles Airport Police Officer Association (LAAPOA) regarding LA City Park Rangers carrying firearms. Ranger Kleckner has received approval from Chief Losorelli to conduct outreach to STNC and other neighboring CD7 NCs on this issue. See two very influential videos that help bring more depth to this topic that have our Rangers discuss their experience being shot at in Elysian Park in October of 2020. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=P5Grphnu318> <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KPIVrUOLP74>**

Sean Kleckner gave the presentation. He stated that there were 28 LA Park Rangers responsible for over 400 parks and that they go through the full training of the LA Police Academy, including for firearms. He stated that Park Rangers address dangerous situations frequently and that Councilwoman Rodriguez refuses to meet with Chief Losorelli. He gave his contact information as (213) 667-7208 and sean.kleckner@lacity.org.

Leny Freeman asked about nonlethal weapons. Officer Kleckner stated that Rangers have TASERS, pepper spray, and batons.

Ed Babakhanian asked about insurance. Officer Kleckner stated that Rangers were protected by the same policies as all other California peace officers.
